A Note from the Nurses

If your child has a G or J tube and/ or receives medications (as well as needed medications, including Diastat, Versed or Epi Pen) while at school, we have sent the physician orders we have on file home for you and the doctor to review, and return for next school year. This will be the only time these preprinted forms will come home and we are putting them in these brightly colored envelopes so they will be easy for you to identify. ☺ It is necessary for us to have the doctor's signature, as indicated on the 'Specialized Treatment', the 'G Tube Feeding' and the 'School Medication Authorization' forms to allow us to care for your child's needs while here at Kauri Sue Hamilton School. (Not all forms apply to all students.) Please make any changes as necessary, and notify the nursing department if there are any changes throughout the school year.

Please submit the forms to your child's doctor (after signing them also!) and have them fax the completed forms to Kauri Sue Hamilton School at (801)-567-8521 attention nurses or sign and return the forms in the mail, or in person. We can fax it to the doctor, however this may cause a delay in treatment as sometimes it takes awhile to get them back. Please remember we must have the signed orders prior to school starting in order to provide the most accurate care to your child, and without them we may not be able to do so. Also remember medications need to be physically brought in and checked in (or put in the drop box if after hours) and the prescription bottle must match the order we have on file.

Please plan to pick up remaining medications for you student **between June 3-5** unless they will be given at ESY. Unfortunately, medications cannot be sent home with the student or with the bus driver. We are not able to keep medications for students over the summer for the next school year as they may expire. Medications left at the school *after* two weeks from the above date will be disposed of per Jordan School District policy with the exception of emergency medications (i.e. Diastat or Versed).
