Guardianship

We had the pleasure of hosting Anamarie Rodabaugh from the Gaurdianship Associates of Utah on November 6th. About 30 parents joined us for the presentation about obtaining guardianship for their child when he turns 18, how to begin the process and some of the most inexpensive ways to complete this legal process. This information was invaluable to those who participated. She dispelled many myths and parents got answers to their specific questions. Anamarie gave us some questions to ask to help families determine if they need to seek guardianship for their child. If you consider these questions for your child, you'll see that all of our students should have guardianship shift to their parents when they reach adulthood. She shared a story about an individual who needed a medical procedure but because she was her own guardian and it was determined she couldn't provide "informed consent", the procedure was delayed weeks while the family gained

guardianship of her. Fortunately, you don't have to seek guardianship at any specific age, you just can't seek it before the individual is 18. Here are the questions to ask that pertain to our students:

- 1. Can my family member effectively discuss issues with medical personnel and other professionals?
- 2. Is my family member unable to provide for their own support and residential environment?
- 3. Can my family member manage the activities of daily living, education, support services, mental and physical health care, medication, therapy or other therapeutic devices?
- 4. Can my family member give informed consent to alternative and less restrictive decisions?
- 5. Does my family member understand the consequences of their decisions?

NURSING NEWS!

Parents/ Guardians'/ Caregivers

It's that time of year again when lots of germs are floating around. We do maintain good hand washing and sanitizing techniques for the staff and students here at KSHS, but just a reminder... Should your child become ill while at school, you or your designee will be asked to take him/her home until they are better. Your child should be at home if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

- NAUSEA, VOMITING, DIARRHEA, ABDOMINAL PAIN
- FEVER ABOVE 100.0
- UNUSUAL DROWSINESS OR TIREDNESS
- SORE THROAT
- VIRAL INFECTION/COLD SYMPTOMS THAT PREVENT NORMAL SCHOOL ACTIVITIES
- PERSISTENT UNUSAL COUGH
- RED INFLAMED EYES WITH A DISCHARGE
- ANY RASH THAT HAS NOT BEEN DIAGNOSED
- HEAD LICE THAT HAS NOT BEEN TREATED
- EARACHE
- · ANY SYMPTOMS WHICH ARE SUGGESTIVE THAT YOUR CHILD IS NOT FEELING WELL
- UNUSUAL OR PROLONGED SEIZURE ACTIVITY, ESPECIALLY IF PRN MEDICATION IS REQUIRED

PLEASE KEEP CHILD HOME:

- UNTIL THE FEVER IS BELOW 100 DEGREES WITHOUT MEDICATION FOR 24 HOURS
- 24 HOURS AFTER SOLID FOOD STAYS DOWN
- UNTIL 24 HOURS AFTER THE LAST EPISODE OF DIARRHEA
- KEEP CHILD WITH THE FLU HOME UNTIL THEY ARE HEALTHY USUALLY 3-5 DAYS

Also, just an FYI, please notify the nursing department of any significant changes in your child's health, such as medication changes (new medicines, discontinued medicines, and as needed medications, even if not given at school), surgeries (recent or up-coming), hospitalizations (and Emergency Room visits), and any other new or different health concerns. We are available all school day so please feel free to call any of us anytime with questions, concerns or information. You may also send information in your child's backpack for nurses, but remember, no medications should be

sent to or from school in the backpacks. You may also email us anytime at <u>KSHS.nurses-uc@jordandistrict.org</u>
