She asked members to consider amending the budget to allow for up to half of the money to be spent on technology for student and teacher use. There are several student computers that need to be replaced. The teacher laptops used in classrooms are used to project lessons onto the screen from, e.g. Starfall for morning group, etc. Everyone present at the meeting voted to make this amendment to our budget for this year. Rita will work with Mike Anderson from the DO to determine how we make this amendment since we've done it before.
