

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE MARCH NEWSLETTER

It's hard to believe that our school has now been open for 9 years. Where has the time gone? As the communities and neighborhoods around us grow, so does our student population; we opened in 2009 with 155 students and we now have 200. With this in mind, I am excited to announce that construction has started on an addition to our building. Six classrooms will be added in the south "backyard" area in a new wing that will attach to the west hallways. As you know, we have been fundraising for a new playground for a few years now too, specifically one that has equipment accessible for our students in wheelchairs. The playground will be built at the same time as the building addition. Construction on both projects is scheduled for completion by mid-December, but we will keep you posted.

Construction crews have been educated about the special needs of our students and are aware of our days off this spring so they can plan their work accordingly. We don't anticipate any classrooms needing to move to other spaces in the building until the summer when inside work will need to be done in order to tie the two hallways together.

If you come to the school you will notice a reduced number of parking spaces due to construction staging in the east parking lot. We apologize in advance if it is an inconvenience for you and your family. Last week we rearranged some bus areas to accommodate the construction in the back and things have gone smoothly.

Our intent is to keep disruption to our school to a minimum but please let me know if you have thoughts or concerns as we move through this process together. If you'd like to acknowledge the district for providing this opportunity for our school, please feel free to thank our School Board who approved this project.

A few Important Reminders:

- In Utah, at age 18, your son or daughter becomes a legal adult. If he/she is not capable of making decisions about day-to-day needs, a parent, family member, or other concerned person must make a request to the Probate court to be appointed as their legal guardian. You can begin this process six to eight weeks before their 18th birthday. Parents do NOT automatically become their adult child's guardian, regardless of disability.
- At this time you can also begin the process of applying for SSI and Disability Medicaid. Once your child turns 18, the parent's income and assets no longer count. For more information about SSI please go to <u>https://www.ssa.gov/ssi/</u>
- We are coming to the end of the Home Energy Assistance Target (H.E.A.T.) Program. If you or someone you know needs help paying their utilities, we might be able to help.

SPRING COLORS IN SPEECH!

While the white snow may still fall in March, we are looking forward to talking about spring colors in the Speech Department. This month, we will be covering the books *Green Eggs and Ham* by Dr. Seuss and *Blue Hat, Green Hat* by Sandra Boynton.

Green Eggs and Ham can be an empowering story about communicating when you don't want something but it also sends the message that it's good to try different things. In some classes we will make an edible treat and talk about sequencing while other groups can experience sensory activities such as hearing a train whistle or feeling the water beneath a boat. We will certainly be talking about the color green throughout the month!

Blue Hat, Green Hat is a silly story about clothing going on wrong body parts. This book enables us to address a variety of goals from discussing articles of clothing, colors, body parts, answering questions and using prepositions such as, "Where does it go?" "On your head!"

Sabotage can be a useful and fun tool for eliciting vocabulary. When your student is getting dressed, try putting clothes on the wrong body part: "Do we put hats on our feet?!" and support the student to say, "No!" and name the correct body part, "It goes on our head! Silly turkey!"

In an effort to help us see the "bigger picture" & give the best nursing care possible, the following information would be incredibly helpful to our nursing and classroom staff. Please notify Kauri Sue Hamilton Nursing with any of the following information. You can leave a message at 801-567-8500 or send an email to <u>kshs.nurses-uc@jordandistrict.org</u> :

Medications (at home or at school): any dosage increase or decrease, or addition or discontinuation of medication, recent immunizations Behavior: aggression, new stim behaviors, change in eating or sleeping patterns or Diagnosis: recent genetic testing results or new diagnosis Illness: doctor confirmed cases of any illness. We especially want to share information about known contagious illnesses with other class members, staff and bus riders Bruises, wounds, scrapes and scratches: please notify us immediately if there are new bruises, abrasions, pressure sores, MRSA wounds etc. Hospital information: EMERGENCY room visits, hospital admissions, new doctor, change in appointments, scheduled surgery

***These changes are important to report so staff, teachers and nursing are better able to monitor for side effects or possible causes of changes, where applicable.
